## UNIVERSITY APPLICATION INFORMATION 2022/23

**Base Application Fee:** \$150 for the initial three program choices in Ontario.

Additional Choice Fee: \$50/choice for each additional program beyond the first three in

Ontario.

**International Service Fee:** \$10 if you are not a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident. **Supplemental Program Fee:** these fees vary and cover the cost of individual faculty admission.

NOTE: All fees are non-refundable.

The OUAC will be making available all Application Access Code Letters (temporary PINs) to the school. Once available, we will distribute them to students. <b>Keep this letter for your records. You will need this information to apply.</b>	
Deadline for completion of online application at <a href="www.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101/">www.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101/</a> <a href="Note: We suggest a deadline of December 23&lt;sup&gt;rd&lt;/sup&gt;">Mote: We suggest a deadline of December 23<sup>rd</sup></a> , in order to avoid the last week rush of high volume and potential site failure. Also, Mrs. Wright and Mr. Craig will be available to assist you if you have questions prior to the Christmas break. Program changes are allowed after the application deadline, but they should not be done unless you contact the university directly to ensure that you have not missed a deadline.	
Upon receipt of the application data from the OUAC, the universities are free to contact applicants with information regarding their admission to the university, scholarships, residences, interviews, etc. Universities may commence making <b>conditional offers</b> of admission as soon as they determine that they have received sufficient academic and application data; offer dates will vary by university and program. Conditional offers may be made based on Grade 11 marks – students will not be declined on the basis of these marks. Universities will wait for Grade 12 final marks.	
The latest date all high school applicants can expect a response from an Ontario university. This includes an offer of admission; a refusal; or a deferral.	
The earliest date an Ontario high school student may be required to respond to an Ontario university offer of admission and give a financial commitment (i.e. registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.) All other admission-related elements, including scholarships, other forms of student assistance or financial incentives, and offers of residence are considered part of the offer of admission. Therefore, a student may accept these other offers before June 1, 2022, but Ontario universities will not compel a student in any way to make a decision earlier than this date.	
The Admission Information Service (AIS), ( <a href="https://www.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101/ais/">https://www.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101/ais/</a> ), is a service that allows applicants to determine which universities may have places remaining in specific programs.	

Note: All universities outside of Ontario have their own application process, fees, and submission deadlines.
